2013 PLEDGE DRIVE OFF TO A GOOD START

The 2013 Pledge Drive is off to a promising start. As of November 11 we received 33 pledges totaling about \$66,000 which is over \$20,000 ahead of the comparable point in last year's drive. However, our target is \$105,000 so we still must work hard to finish our annual fund drive with a strong effort.

Typically pledge payments constitute about 70% of our church's operating receipts and are utilized to pay day to day bills such as insurance, heat, light, employee wages and building repairs. This money also maintains important church outreach and assistance programs so we can spread the Word of Christ. However, even if we reach our pledge goal of \$105,000 we will need to rely on other sources of income such as fund raisers, special offerings from members and support from summer visitors as well as tight spending controls to keep our church on sound financial footing.

We thank all of you who have supported Caldwell Presbyterian Church's 2013 Pledge Drive and encourage those of you who have not yet pledged to do so in the near future.
