Our 2013 Pledge Drive started with strong early momentum but pledges tailed off in mid-November. As of November 18th, we received total pledges of about \$75,000 which constitutes the best mid-November results of any pledge drive at Caldwell since 2005. At that point we were hopeful of achieving our 2013 goal of \$105,000 in pledges. However, the rate of pledges then slowed and as of December 10th we received about \$93,000 in pledges for 2013 from 44 families. This puts us on a pace to fall well short of our goal.

Pledge donations make up over 70% of our church operating income and are critical to paying our bills. More importantly, these donations allow us to spread the Word of Christ and to reach out to help people in our community, region and world.

If you have already pledged, we thank you. If you have not yet had the opportunity to pledge, please do so soon. Remember, at this point just a few pledges can make a powerful difference.

NEWS FROM THE HAITI MISSION SCHOOL

Unlike us, the Haitians don't celebrate thanksgiving, but like us they do celebrate Christmas. Unlike us, they won't be spending an average of \$854 per family on gifts this Christmas (according to an American Research Group survey) but like us they will probably gather with family and attend church services. And they may even have a special meal. But one thing is for certain: On New Year's Day, they will eat Joumou (a pumpkin soup pronounced joomoo).

New Year's Day is independence day for Haitians... the day in 1804 that the Haitian slaves declared victory over the French. In the US we eat hot dogs and shoot off fireworks on Independence Day. The Haitians eat Journou. Why? The French wouldn't allow the slaves to eat it. They considered it far too much of a delicacy for the slaves' palate. So as a result, on their first independence day their new leader Jean-Jacques Dessalines declared Journou for everyone. And thus on New Year's Day Haitians, wherever they may be, will eat Journou!

In January, JoEllen and I will again travel to Haiti. This year we will bring four others with us. This will be the first time we have taken a team to visit the school. We plan to spend ten days there, leaving Friday, Jan. 25 and returning Sunday Feb. 3. Plans are still being formulated, but a couple of things we hope to do are to construct some student desks and look at some other projects that we might accomplish at a future date. We also hope to visit a couple of other schools in the area and bring some needed supplies to the local hospital.

Our annual report is complete and we will be sending it along with updated pictures of children shortly to those on our mailing list. If you would like to be on the mailing list or simply receive the report, please either email us at haitimissionschool@gmail.com or by snail mail to our address:

The good news is that we finished the year in the black, even though we have paid for the cistern, the food program, continuing education for our teachers, bibles for 3rd graders and tuition for those 6th graders who are attending another school. We will also be sending out tax statements to those individuals and groups that made contributions this year. If you are

expecting one and don't receive it by the end of January, please contact us at one of the above addresses.

We are gratified to note that several churches including the Watseka Christian Church in Watseka Illinois, the Bay Road, Hamilton Union and Schoharie Presbyterian Churches in New York were added to our list of partner and supporting congregations this year. We have made contacts with a few others and remain eager to make presentations at any time. We also apologize to all those who didn't get our newsletter article last month, as we were a little tardy in sending it out.

Once again, we want to thank all those who have supported the school in any way, whether it be in prayer or in tangible ways.

Pre-School Committee Update

It is still our plan and desire to move full steam ahead with the Pre-School re-opening in September. Hopefully by now you have already seen the press release sent to several newspapers. It was very exciting to have the Mayor, School Superintendent, Elementary School Principal and Pastor Chad in a photo under the banner declaring that registration is now open! So far the committee is still a little under \$3,000 short of its financial requirement as stipulated by the session, but do know that this committee will be working diligently this spring to obtain the necessary funds to make this happen.

Here is a quick update of our timeline for the month of January:

This month we are taking registrations through the church office and renovation is scheduled to begin on the floors and bathrooms in the Pre-School Wing!

We also hope to start interviewing qualified applicants for the School Director Position.


Our items of the month are:
