CHURCH: 2013 First
Quarter Financial
Situation

The first two months of 2013 were slow and we were behind both 2012 results and 2013 budget. However, we had a strong March which was even more encouraging considering Easter's receipts were deposited on April 1 and will be included in April's results. Pledge receipts for the month of March, 2013 were 5% ahead of the March 2013 budget for pledges. Overall operating receipts for March 2013 were 11% ahead of the March 2013 budget. After paying our bills, the operating gain for March 2013 was \$1,685.

The results year to date (YTD) for the first quarter of 2013 (including January through March) are as follows:

- 2013 YTD pledge receipts are 7.5% behind budget.
- 2013 YTD operating receipts are 16% behind 2013 budget as other categories of receipts were down percentage wise more than pledges in January and February.
- 2013 YTD pledge receipts are 5% behind first quarter 2012 but overall operating receipts in 2013 YTD are 4% ahead of 2012.
- After expenses, Operating Gain for the first quarter of 2013 was \$1,328. This is favorable to the 2013 budget due to under-spending in most cost categories. At this point in time, our budgeted Operating Gain of \$1,909 for all of 2013 appears attainable.

(Note: the phrase "operating receipts" has the same meaning as "Budgeted Income" on the Treasurer's Report-All Funds.)

2013 first quarter church attendance (including Easter) averaged 81 people per service compared to 61 in 2012 and 65 in 2011. (If one adjusts for the timing of Easter in 2012 and 2011, past attendance was 63 and 72 respectively.) 2013 Easter attendance exceeded 2012 by 58 people. This is a positive trend for this time of year.

We anticipate April will be a good month and we should recover from our slow start to 2013.

MISSON of the MONTH

The Mission of the Month for May, is the Regional Food Bank of Northeastern New York. It is one of 10 Regional Banks in New York State and is a member of Feed America.

Feed America sets standards and acquires food donations from national companies for its 200+ member food banks, located throughout the country. Their mission is to feed America's hungry through its nationwide network and t engage our country in the fight to end hunger.

The Regional Food Bank provides food assistance to over 1,000 charitable agencies serving hungry and disadvantaged people, including Food Pantries, Soup Kitchens, Emergency Shelters, Youth Programs, Senior Programs and Programs for the Disabled. In 2011, they distributed 775,614 pounds of food t agencies in Warren County alone. The Regional Food Bank service area encompasses 41% of the landmass of New York State. The Food Bank operates in an efficient manner and devotes 89.7 cents of every dollar to programs and operations. They strive to minimize costs and maximize the amount of food they provide to agencies feeding hungry people. They are proud to report that they distribute \$10 worth of food for every dollar they spend!

Caldwell Church Preschool



NEWS FROM THE HAITI MISSION SCHOOL



By the time you receive this newsletter, we will be in Haiti again. Since spring has been so long in coming to upstate New York, we will finally be warm without sitting by the woodstove. Meanwhile, It's a blessing to us that we can leave the house and Mr. Cat in the able care of "Madam Flo" while we are gone. We hope that it's warm enough that they can enjoy the house without the stove.

We received some good news from Haiti this week. Our lead teacher, Prof. Kenold Deralin has informed us that after three long years, he has now passed all the requirements to graduate from Teacher's College with his degree. We are eager to celebrate this good news with him when we arrive and if the dates work out, perhaps even be able to attend his graduation ceremonies with him.

As we wrote last month, we are also eager to meet with our sixth graders who will graduate from the *Haiti Mission School* this spring. These are our first graduates who've been with us from the beginning and we celebrate with them as well. Some of them will likely want to go on with their education and we hope to be able to scholarship a few of them to our equivalent of middle school.

At an assembly of the students, we will give our third graders bibles and small gifts for everyone. The children will present some skits, sing songs and read for us as they demonstrate some of the skills they are learning. They will also sing in the Labastile Church on Sunday as they do once a month and we plan to join them and their families for this service. We will also worship in the Jeremie Church one Sunday and likely get to preach at both Labastile and Jeremie.

The spring trip is also the time for our annual planning meeting with the *Committee*. We will plan for the coming year and approve a budget. Once again, thanks to every one of you who have prayed for us, the school and your students, and thank you for your continued financial support which makes it all possible. And a special thank you to all who provided bags, crib sheets, quilts and other items for the *Crossroads Baby Program* for abandoned infants which has been developed and maintained by an ecumenical group of young Christians in Jeremie.

Here's another poem I wrote after the last trip. Hope you enjoy:

One at a time

Have you heard the star thrower story?

A man walks a beach littered with starfish.

Stooping, he picks one up...throws it into the water.

He is accosted by one who asks

"Why do that? You can't possibly save them all!"

"True," he replies as he casts another one in.

"But that one... that one has been helped."

This philosophy guides us as we do our work in Haiti.

No, we can't save the nation. It's not our calling.

There are many we will not help.

But that one... yes to that one we will give the opportunity

To perhaps save him/herself.
