Haiti Mission School Update

The spring trip to Haiti was successful in that we accomplished much of what we set out to do. It was made more difficult by Tortug Airlines which (we hope temporarily) is not flying to Jeremie. This meant traveling by bus between Port Au Prince and Jeremie instead of flying (10 hours instead of 45 minutes), thus using two of our work days for travel. Such is life in the thirdworld.

Our spring trip is mostly business-related. We negotiated a budget for the upcoming school year and worked on other items with the local committee. This consumed a total of four meetings and 12 intense hours of work yet we accomplished much.

One project which we have been working on for three years is getting our license from the Haitian Dept. of Education. This will allow our sixth graders to take the official national exams. Only when they have passed those exams are they eligible to continue on to secondary schools. This year we had to send our students to another school that offers the exams. We are very hopeful that the assurance we were given by the Principle Inspector for the region will turn out to be true, and we will have a permit that will allow us to offer the exams for the 2013-14 school year. Our Committee in Haiti also asked us about offering 7th grade classes or giving scholarships to those who would like to continue their education. We'll write more about this next month.

23 Students who received Bibles

We give Creole bibles to the graduating third graders during our spring visit. After much thought and planning, JoEllen decided that we had 17 students eligible this year who had not already received bibles. But since we had a few (6) extra bibles we carried them with us. When we finished giving out the bibles, we noted that several students raised their hands. The teacher told us that they were also eligible. It turned out that there were 6 additional students eligible. THANKS BE TO GOD WHO PLANS BETTER THAN WE DO! The service concluded with laying on hands as the students knelt after receiving the bibles. It was very moving.

One other event touched our hearts in a special way. We attended church at Labastille one of the two Sundays we were there. In Haiti, many churches have marching brigades. The church at Labastille is one of those. Following

the service that day, the brigade led us all the way back to the main road and then up to the pastor's house playing the drums and singing songs including the Haitian version of Auld Lang Syne.

We are already looking forward to February 2014 when we hope to visit again.

We are very hopeful that we will be able to take a team to examine eyes and provide glasses. More about this in next month's news from the Haiti Mission School.
