Dear Caldwell Family,

It's a perennial temptation to construct in my imagination a list of things I'd like to accomplish as the Gregorian calendar starts fresh. Always at the top of my list are eating healthier foods, exercising regularly, and carving out more time for quiet. But as the years go by, I watch how the New Year settles in, and by about the third week in January, I've already lost my way with my resolutions.

Another factor has come into play in my adult years since becoming a mom 11 years ago, and that is deep concerns for the suffering and strife in our world. Each morning I have a habit of walking into the kitchen, turning on the radio to NPR, and then making the coffee and the girls' lunches. The stories of war and age old disputes wear on and take with them innocent lives and precious futures, and it is unsettling at best, more like horrifying to behold the brokenness of our world. Sometimes I have to turn the radio off when the children wake up.

I consider in these moments our place on the timeline of eternity. Where do we stand in the evolution of human existence, and what can we do to contribute to building good in God's name for our time? I'm comforted by figures in history who have taken seriously the same question and whose lives show forth their answer. One such figure from the 13th Century was St. Francis of Assisi. Born into wealth, he could have kept a distance from the ravages and realities of his time. After his conversion, as he lived out his faith life, he could have removed himself from this world and retreated to his monastery. But he didn't. He did just the opposite. He realized that the only way to live a life of faith was to live it amidst the toils and snares, the joys and sorrows, immersed in everyday life. Attributed to St. Francis is the line, "preach the gospel always; when necessary, use words."

And so as we step into the New Year 2015, let us find courage to bravely walk our earthly way, and even hope to be part of the building of something good in God's name. The prayer of St. Francis is perhaps the loveliest prayer I know. Let's commit it to memory this year, and know it by heart, so that just as generations before ours have lived by its values, so we might also.

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace; Where there is hatred, let me sow love;

Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is discord, harmony;

Where there is error, truth; Where there is doubt, faith;

Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light;

And where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, Grant that I may not so much seek

To be consoled as to console; To be understood as to understand;

To be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive;

It is in pardoning that we are pardoned; And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.


regular teachers. We have a few of you in mind and will be coming to you personally. We encourage anyone interested to contact myself, Judy or Laura.

The Mission Committee

The Mission Committee has, for a number of reasons, decided the system of selecting four missions (local, regional, national and international) to support, as we did last year, was too limiting. Therefore, beginning in January, we have returned to our previous method of offering a special mission each month. Among other reasons, it will allow us to better to respond to emergencies at home and around the world such as this month's offering:

January Mission of the Month—GLENS FALLS CODE BLUE SHELTER

AT WHAT TEMPERATURE IS YOUR THERMOSTAT SET? IMAGINE YOU HAD NO THERMOSTAT OR EVEN A ROOF OVER YOUR HEAD WHEN THE TEMPERATURE OUTSIDE WENT BELOW 20 DEGREES! IMAGINE BEING HOMELESS ON A COLD WINTER'S NIGHT! THIS IS NOT SOMETHING MOST OF US WOULD LIKE TO IMAGINE, AND YET IT IS WHAT THOSE WHO ARE HOMELESS MIGHT FACE WITHOUT THE CODE BLUE SHELTER.

When we think of the homeless, we often tend to think of men with substance abuse of mental



health problems. While this is true for some, others are homeless due to domestic abuse, loss of a job, large medical bills or a host of other reasons. The homeless may include men, women, teens, children, the elderly, veterans, or even people with jobs who don't make enough to pay for housing.

Our Caldwell Mission of the month for January is the Glens Falls "CODE BLUE" shelter. Glens Falls CODE BLUE provides emergency overnight shelter to homeless people in the Greater Glens Falls Area. A CODE BLUE night is called when the forecast is for a temperature of 20 degrees or lower (including wind chill) or at least 12 inches of snowfall.

Last winter was the coldest in recent memory. The Glens Falls **Code Blue** shelter helped a total of 53 people over the 71 nights they were open. The largest number they served on one night was 19 people.

Monetary donations can be made any time during the month of January. Please make the check out to Caldwell and note "Code Blue" on it, or place your donation in a Mission Envelope found in the pew. 
NEWS FROM THE HAITI MISSION SCHOOL

In November, we had a good (and very busy) trip to Haiti. The weather was a balmy 80-90 degrees and we encountered no rain. This is always good news since we spend much time riding motorcycles and walking while we are there. Much of our time was spent in meetings with teachers, committees, government officials, family members of Government officials, and the young man who is managing the food program.

We were able to spend time with the 11 students we are providing with scholarships to the secondary school at Latibolliere. We were pleased to see the school and hear them say they felt well prepared by The Haiti Mission School for secondary school. Our current students were also encouraged to come to school each day, study hard and be good citizens. They were reminded we would be providing scholarships to secondary school for six of the best students each year.



During our February trip to Haiti, one team member, Jed Moody, brought soccer goals for the school. As a result, members of the church donated space for a soccer field. When we arrived at the school this time, the students were at recess and were making great use of the new field the students had cleared.



In addition to school, we went to the local hospital children's ward and brought some toys and other items for the children. Several of the parents had prescriptions for their children that they could not afford, and we were able to assist them.

We also visited "The Rock" orphanage in Jèrèmie, brought toys and played with the children. JoEllen had a crowd surrounding her and helping her blow bubbles while Howard's camera was a real hit. We also brought a "One World" soccer ball which we donated. It was a pleasure to donate a "futbol" or two to several places in the Jeremie area

Unfortunately, he was in Japan and so was unable to talk with us about government interest in the school.
