Perhaps you'd like to cook a meal for someone recovering from surgery, or help in the Food Pantry, or teach a Sunday school class. Perhaps you've been volunteering in the same way for a long time and you'd like to try something new.

There was once a time when vocation referred to clergy only, and it meant a retreat from the world to join a monastic way of life. But our Reformed tradition teaches otherwise: that all of us have a calling; a job to do; that God calls us to love the world and to live into it boldly, and give what we can for the life of the community. The exciting thing is discovering how God works in us in new ways with each new season of life.

I invite you to prayerfully consider the new thing God is doing in you. Come to church on Sept 13th, ready to share it with the beloved community of Caldwell, to the blessing of many, and for the life of the world.

Don't miss the first day back to Sunday school! We will be having a group activity and ice cream party.



September News from the Haiti Mission School

It's time for school again. Schools in Haiti are scheduled to open September 7. This will be the tenth year for the Haiti Mission School. All the teachers will be returning and we are looking forward to another good year. Since this is our tenth year, we would like to take a few moments here to reflect on progress that has been made.

The first thing, of course, is that three classes have graduated. Of these classes, we have been able to provide scholarship aid for 18 students who have gone on to the nearby secondary school. Even more important is that by the time the students have completed the third grade, they can read books, do basic arithmetic, have a basic knowledge of science, including such even more basic things such as personal hygiene.

We are also pleased that since the earthquake in 2010, we have been able to provide a hot meal each school day for students and teachers. We worked with the Haitians to build a cistern and to provide water purification so that clean drinking water is available at the school. For the past three years we have been able to give all third grade students bibles in their creole language—a book that for many will be the first book in their homes.

A by product of all this is that our eight employees (six teachers and two cooks) receive salaries that while not great by our standards, are considerably above the Haitian national income averages. Furthermore, a number of our students and parents are also attending the church at Labastille that has provided space for the school.

Finally it is true that little of this could be done without God's blessing and the backing of many churches and individuals who have provided much prayer and financial support over the years. For this we give thanks.

Now on to the coming year... We hope to continue our discussions with the Haitian Education Department about working more closely together, particularly concerning teacher salaries. However this will have to wait until after the upcoming Presidential elections in Haiti. These are "scheduled" for October 25. I say "scheduled", because like many things in Haiti, they are subject to change. Also, for those of us who think that the number of people running for President in the U.S is a lot, there are currently <u>56 candidates</u> running for the office in Haiti.

Outgoing President Michael Martelli, who can't run for a second consecutive term, had a goal of to providing free primary education for all Haitian children. We have been pleased to join him in this important objective. We certainly hope the new President will continue this policy and that the man we are working with in the education department will be retained after the election. All of this

remains to be seen in a country where things can often change in a flash.

Our Board of Directors will have met by the time you are receiving this newsletter. There should be more information by the time the next newsletter comes out. Meanwhile, we thank you for your continued prayers for the students, teachers, parents and all the others who are involved with the Haiti Mission School.
