I'm in South Carolina visiting my parents and send you greetings from this heavenly spot. The rhythm of the ocean and the constant steady push and pull of the waves upon the shore are a reminder to me of our Creator God and all God's awesome deeds, and so I proclaim with the Psalmist: "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; for he has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers." Babysitting is available at Caldwell and I hear my husband is one of the adults in charge which translates as, kids, be ready for some serious silliness and fun!

Also on the evening of April 15, and on a slightly different note, we welcome our guest Speaker, Jeanne Bishop, author of Change of Heart, which reads like a journal and tells of her extraordinary journey over two decades of coming to forgiveness and reconciliation with her sister's killer. The current issue of The Chronicle has an extensive article beginning on the 3rd page if you'd like to learn more. The event is being co-hosted by Caldwell and First Presbyterian Church of Glens Falls, and will take place there at First Pres, beginning at 7 pm, followed by a reception. (It's possible to stop by the Preschool fundraiser and still make it to First Pres in time to hear Jeanne. That's my plan!) You do not need to read her book in advance of her talk, but I highly recommend you do. It will invite you to think about forgiveness in new dimensions and it may enrich your faith life as it has mine. Our ecumenical book group had been studying forgiveness throughout Lent and Jeanne's book about restorative justice continues our conversation and brings it to even deeper levels. I urge all of you to not miss this extraordinary opportunity to connect with Jeanne live.

And finally, <u>Confirmation!</u> I will be inviting all students in grades 9-12 to join me in a 6 week Confirmation class beginning May 1 and ending on Youth Sunday on June 12 (no class Mother's Day). There will be one interfaith experience, opportunity for service, exploring statements of faith, connecting with a mentor, and learning together some of the highlights of church history, bible, and theology from the Reformed tradition of the PC(USA). Meetings will be held on Sundays following worship along with some outings.

The sun is awake now, and so am I. I close with some of my favorite words of blessing as you live into Spring:

Deep peace of the shining stars to you,



#### Words to Ponder:

The father said to is elder son, "My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found."

(Lk 15:1-3, 11-32)

The prodigal son is one of Jesus' best' known parables. In the closing scene, the elder son refused to join the celebration, so the father goes to plead with him. It ends there and we never know whether the elder son went in or stayed out. Here is an imaginary ending.

While the father and elder son are arguing in the backyard, the mother comes out and says, "Now I have had just about enough." To her husband, "You've always favored our youngest and you know it. Our elder son works hard every day and you take him for granted. I hardly ever hear you say "thank you," except to the hired hands. It's about time you started noticing your family for a change."

Then to the elder son, "And you...always the martyr. You act as if you're the only one who has to go the extra mile. Well, I have to do it and so does everybody else. It's time you learned to swallow hard and rise about the things in life that are unfair. Stop your silly pouting."

She then goes and gets the younger son. "And you, the spoiled little prince—in there celebrating and you never even thought to ask about your brother and apologize for leaving him to do all the work. It's about time you realized that the whole world doesn't revolve around you."

Then to the three of them, "Work out your differences some other time. We've got company, so get in there and start acting like family instead of three-year-olds."

Reconcíliations can be complicated. But that's no reason not to reconcíle.

#### **NEWS FROM THE HAITI MISSION SCHOOL FOR APRIL 2016**



On Sunday March 6, Tom and JoEllen led worship at Shaftsbury United Methodist Church in Shaftsbury VT. Shaftsbury has been one of our supporting congregations and invited us to visit and lead worship. In the service, during the children's moment, JoEllen talked of the need for pure drinking water and shared the story of the water filer straws which we will be taking to Haiti in April..

Since several towns near Shaftsbury are dealing with the threat of PFOA in their water, it was a timely message. The love offering they took that morning raised over \$600 to go to the purchase of the straws. Meanwhile donations from Caldwell Presbyterian and Trinity Presbyterian have us nearing our goal of 200 straws.

The team from Bay Road Church had a good and productive trip to Haiti in February One of their favorite parts of the visit was at the secondary school where some of our graduates attend. The team subdivided into small groups and had a chance to visit with the stu-




dents and share about their lives. One member of the team, Charlotte Holding shared that she had just been learning about Haiti's revolution and one of its heroes Toussaint Louverture. The Haitians said that they had just been studying about Louverture also.

The team from Trinity Presbyterian in Scotia New York going to Haiti in April has been meeting once each month. The last meeting focused on going through the team manual and making certain that inoculations have been done, passports are in order and a discussion of funding for the trip.

Meanwhile, Steve Parsons who is leading this trip met with JoEllen and Tom and discussed details of housing, transportation, funding and scheduling. He is beginning to realize just how much is involved in planning a trip for a group.

#### Mission of the Month for April—Children's Defense Fund



#### Did you know:

The United States has the second highest child poverty rate among 35 industrialized countries despite having the largest economy in the world.

A child in the United States has a 1 in 5 chance of being poor and the younger she is the poorer she is likely to be.

A child of color, who will be in the majority of U.S. children in 2020, is more than twice as likely to be poor as a White child.

Growing up poor has lifelong negative consequences, decreasing the likelihood of graduating from high school and increasing the likelihood of becoming a poor adult, suffering from poor health, and becoming involved in the criminal justice system.

These impacts cost the nation at least half a trillion dollars a year in lost productivity and increased health and crime costs. Letting a fifth of our children grow up poor prevents them from having equal opportunities to succeed in life and robs the nation of their future contributions.
