Introducing....The LAKE GEORGE TEEN CENTER

Dear Caldwell Family,

I am thrilled to share some very exciting news with you. Beginning last winter, Caldwell has been engaged in a conversation with Lake George High School, the LG Public Library, our sister congregations at Sacred Heart and St. James, and some devoted community leaders, to explore how Lake George might unite around the idea of creating a safe space for High School students after school. This is not a *new* idea—it has been considered many times over the years and some important strides have been made. But still, an after school program has eluded the Lake George community. After many thoughtful conversations and the wonderful camaraderie shared at our strategy sessions, with the insights gleaned from LG students whom we surveyed last Spring, and with the unanimous vote of approval at the August 8th Lake George Town Board Meeting, we will launch the Lake George Teen Center this Sept.!

WHERE: Jack Abrahams, the president of the Lake George Senior Center, presented to the board the idea that the Teen Center be housed twice a week at the Lake George Senior Center on 22 Schuyler Street. If you've visited the Senior Center, you know what a handsome building it is, complete with a wonderful gathering room with plenty of tables and chairs, wifi, and a kitchen. There is space outdoors for a basketball court, and the basement floor already has a pool table and room to grow as a lounge space for our teens.

TRANSPORT, HOURS, and VISION: A school bus will run from the High School to the Senior Center (aka the Teen Center) on Wednesdays and Thursdays beginning September 14. The Teen Center will open at 3:30 p.m. and close at 5:30 p.m. The Teen Center will provide a safe space where the kids can relax, build relationships, have a snack after school, and get some tutoring for those who want it.

BUT THERE IS A LARGER VISION AT PLAY, AND HERE'S WHERE YOU COME IN:
From the first moment we began our discussions about a Teen Center, the idea of building relationships has driven our thoughts and dreams. We hope the Teen Center is a place where every student feels a sense of belonging, and has opportunities to make connections with adult volunteers who are invested in them and support them and want to see them grow and thrive.

*We need volunteers to help staff and supervise the center. Each of our sister churches has been charged with the responsibility of providing at least one volunteer per week to help cover the two hour shifts.

PLEASE VOLUNTEER!!

If you have two extra hours in your week on occasion

if you like the idea of investing in the community

if you like the idea of getting to know some of the kids growing up here

if you want to help make a difference in a child's life

if you have a certain expertise in a foreign language, English writing, math, etc, and are willing to help students with their coursework as a tutor on occasion

If you know you are free for one day, but not sure about more than that

Simply call the church office 668-2613 and let us know and we will schedule accordingly.

What we need to do is **GET STARTED**. We have a great location, we have the wonderful support of the school, the library, and the churches in our community, the town board who operates the building unanimously supports the idea, and so now we need you—volunteers—to help staff the center. We will be using social media and we are pursuing grants to help pay for food for snacks. What we can't predict is the level of investment from the rest of us. I hope you will join me in volunteering your time and your talents to support this new initiative, which has been a long time coming.

What a wonderful way to carry on the Caldwell spirit of community investment in Lake George, and in our youth, to build toward a brighter future for us all.





September Mission of the Month: Haiti Mission School

Initiated by Tom and JoEllen Parsons, two of Caldwell's active participants, the school is now entering its tenth year. During that time, the school has grown from one class of 24 kindergarten/first graders to a complete primary school (K/1-6) which last year had 147 students enrolled. Three classes have graduated and last year, 15 of our top graduates were receiving scholarships to a nearby secondary school.

Haiti provides some public education in the cities, but in the countryside virtually all schools are provided by extra-governmental organizations such as ours, many with religious ties. However, most of these schools charge tuition, which bars many children from attending. Although tuition by our standards is low (most around \$100-\$150/year) average family incomes are in the \$500-\$800 range. In the countryside where our school is, incomes are even lower. To send even one child to school is a stretch for them.

For this reason, we made the decision this would be a free school. We provide all the materials necessary for our students' education. We pay for cloth for uniforms (parents sew the uniforms). We pay all costs for books, paper, pencils, benches and desks, pay the teachers' salaries, and all the other costs of education. Because we know that a hungry child doesn't learn as well as one who has been fed, we also provide a daily hot meal. A local church provides the classroom space and a local board provides oversight.

The majority of our students come from illiterate homes. Children often arrive, never having seen a book, held a pencil or crayon, learned how to spell or do even simple addition or subtraction. Still, they come with a great eagerness to learn.

This is where you come in. Your support for the school provides the opportunity for the children of this impoverished rural area to achieve success. Thank you for your continuing support!

September News from the Haiti Mission School

As students and teachers prepare to return to school in Haiti, the nation itself is in crisis. A strike by resident doctors in eleven state hospitals has left much of the country without medical services for the poorest of Haitians.

According to a report by Fox News, and confirmed by the Miami Herald, "Young doctors and interns walked off the job in March to protest chronic shortages of basic medical supplies, dismal pay and working conditions so unsafe that relatives of patients routinely threaten them, even storming into operating rooms with handguns".



The strike which began in Port Au Prince soon spread to 12 other government-run hospitals throughout the nation (including the one in Jèrèmie) and the striking doctors were soon joined by nurses and other staff. They were protesting not only poor wages (Haitian doctors receive only \$120/month) but lack of critical medical supplies and equipment.

All of this has been exacerbated by the Haitian government which is in limbo due to the failure to complete the presidential elections in December of last year. The interim president, Jocelerme Privert was installed for 120 days when the previous president, Michael Martelly was forced to step down by the constitution which allows a Haitian President only one 5-year term. The 120-day period has expired and elected lawmakers have been unable to agree on whether to allow Privert to continue, or to replace him with another.

In addition to all this, many Haitians accused the U.S. of meddling in internal politics during the previous election. Whether we indeed interfered this time or not, the U.S. has a long history of "helping" the Haitians make political decisions. As a result, the Obama administration has decided to not help pay for the next round of elections, currently scheduled to take place October 9. (This time only 24 people are running--last time it was 53)

Now for some good news.

Thanks to the continuing donations by many organizations and individuals (like you), the Haiti Mission School is scheduled to open on time as usual. We are anticipating full classes and are expecting all our staff, with the possible exception of Jean Paul, who has had serious surgery last spring, to return in the fall.

Last fall, it was reported that the cistern at the school, originally completed in 2012, had developed some leaks and needed to be repaired. In order to do this, the cistern would need to be drained. So this past spring during our visit to the school, we hired a mason to drain the cistern and repair it over the summer. The work has now been completed and summer rains have hopefully refilled it so that it will be available for the school this fall.
