

Dear Caldwell Church Family,

Last Sunday we sang the first verse of the favorite hymn, "O Little Town of Bethlehem," for the children during our Time with Young Disciples in worship. It was a beautiful moment as you, the congregation, softly sang the words to our little ones, teaching the next generation of the faithful growing up in our midst one of Advent's most precious traditions. The words to the hymn were written by Phillips Brooks, an Episcopal Priest, in 1868, after a visit to Bethlehem and the Holy Land. Theologically, Brooks' words sum up what Advent is all about. He wrote the poem for the Sunday School children, and his organist, Lewis Redner, added the music. Neither of them ever expected their collaboration would last beyond the Christmas of 1868, let alone become one of the most beloved Christmas hymns of all time, and that fact makes me cherish it even more.

During the Advent season, the church prepares for the coming of Christ. God's people summon the courage and the spiritual strength to remember that the holy does indeed break into our daily lives. In ways both recognizable and barely noticeable, the grace of God meets us during this heightened season. Our challenge, our prayer, is to stay open to God's healing grace, and the way of peace.

"How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given
So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of His heaven
No ear may hear His coming but in this world of sin
Where meek souls will receive him still the dear Christ enters in."

May yours be an active Advent, may your posture be one of leaning forward, watching, listening, anticipating the miracle of Emmanuel, God with us, each and every day. And may that promise alone, for which we wait along with the church universal, bless you with renewed hope this holy season.

"O holy Child of Bethlehem descend to us, we pray
Cast out our sin and enter in, be born to us today
We hear the Christmas angels, the great glad tidings tell
O come to us, abide with us, Our Lord Emmanuel."



DECEMBER NEWS FROM THE HAITI MISSION SCHOOL



JOELLEN PARSONS AND HOWARD NICOLS RESPOND TO NEEDS IN HAITI FOLLOWING THE HURRICANE

The crying need in the Jèrèmie area of Haiti following Hurricane Matthew's rampage was for three basics: food, shelter and pure water. Responding to those needs was a major part of JoEllen and Howard's recent trip. They brought a few tarps and purchased others in Haiti which they distributed to area residents.

They also brought 130 Sawyer Water filters with them. Each filter can process up to 175 gallons of water each day by simply pouring water into the bucket and then opening the spigot on the bucket and letting the water drain through the filter. They purchased the buckets locally and helped install the filters in the buckets. The filter buckets were then distributed to people in the area. In the picture at left, Howard is posing with a man who is receiving one of the filter systems. Meanwhile we continued sending food up to the Labastille area

where the school had been and the food was then given to parents of our students.

In the hotel where Howard and JoEllen were staying, they met the director of the Haiti Medical Association. He had brought some medical teams with him and JoEllen asked if they would be willing to




bring a team up to Labastille and provide some medical care. He agreed, and the next day the team saw more than 180 members of families of our students and other area residents.

They visited the church/orphanage at Chateau that Howard has been working

with. There they brought food, medicine, roof tarps and bucket filters. In the picture at left, Howard and Junior Eustache are preparing the bucket filters to give to church members.

While there they also visited an orphanage in Jèrèmie where they serenaded by the children. They gave a bucket filter and a candle sent by the children of the Caldwell Presbyterian Sunday School. The young man in this picture accompanied the singing on his homemade drum set. The set is made from old bicycle parts and other things he could find, beg or borrow. It is an example of Haitian ingenuity which we see everywhere, particularly in difficult times such as this. Howard commissioned the young man to make another set for the church at Chateau.



These are but a few of the stories. Meanwhile we continue to send food once each month to the LaBastille area where the school had been. There the food is distributed among the parents of our students. The utter devastation of their fruit trees, fields and animals is heartbreaking. Little other help reaches the countryside. In another response to this need, they donated \$2,000 to a seed group established by Lindsay Anderson, one of our American friends in Haiti. By the time they left, this group had raised more than \$5,000 to establish a seed bank for area farmers. The need was immediate because the seeds need to be in the ground during this, the rainy season. Much of the seed is already distributed and in the ground. Hopefully, in three months' time, the farmers will be able to harvest their first crop and repay the seed bank with new seeds. We join the people seen and mentioned here and many others in thanking you for your continuing prayers, encouragement and support

Mission of the Month Update

Hello from the Mission Committee. We wanted to give you a quick summary of the events of the last few months.

August: Shelter Box We have raised \$861 towards the amount for a complete box. We would like to raise the additional \$139 in December. If you feel like helping, please note that Mission money should be put towards Shelter Box

September October: <u>Haiti Mission School</u> We all know of the terrible hurricane that wiped out the school. Our congregation stepped up and got behind the school and Haiti disaster relief. During these two months, we raised \$11,938!!!

<u>Haiti Water Project</u> This was spearheaded by Charlie Fuller. His Eagle Scout project is to provide safe drinking water. This raised \$1102!

November: Operation Christmas Child (Shoebox Gifts) We were able to send 58 boxes to Samaritans Purse.

<u>Alternate Gift table</u> This will be in the Fellowship room 12/4. This will support the Regional Food Bank, North Country Mission, Haiti Mission School and the Heifer Project. Community Dinner: We cooked dinner on 11/29 and served on 11/30.

December: Shelterbox Our goal is to raise the final \$139.
