healing touches, wondrous stories, great banquets, first suppers, broken bread, crosses, and resurrections...

Throughout these summer months, nurture in me the song of a lover, the vision of a poet, the questions of a child, the boldness of a prophet, the courage of a disciple...O Lord, it is said you created people because you love stories.

Be with me as I live out my story.



News from the Haiti Mission School

As I sit here and ponder about the people of Haiti and their future.....about the violence and chaos that continues to manifest itself in their streets....I wearily wonder, as I know so many of our Haitian brothers and sisters do, and as the Psalmist did in chapter 13:1 "How long, O LORD??? How long??? Will you forget me forever?? How long will You hide Your face from me???" How long will You let this go on??? We are tired and weary and hungry and discouraged and afraid....please help us!! And I pray with them, "please help." There are times, I am certain, when they want to give up and I surely feel the same. Then I remember back....I see the faces of our students..hear their voices....watch their progress...worship with them and I am convinced that God is truly in this place suffering as they suffer and evil may endure for the long night yet God will hold them, carry them and God will prevail. I am encouraged when I read what the Lord says through the Prophet Isaiah in chapter 43:18...."Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past; Look, I am doing a new thing!!!".... "I will make a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland." And so I forge on...we forge on together and with God to make a difference where and when and while we can. We will feed and educate and encourage and pray, and as best we can, be a part of whatever new thing God is and will create from this chaos...remembering that in the beginning all was chaos and that sometimes God does God's best work in that environment.



As we understand it, school will remain in session through July, because of the late start. Because there is no current government except Prime Minister Ariel Henry, it is often difficult to understand who is making these decisions and where they are making them. Yet, we abide by them and continue to try to find ways to support and encourage our staff, students and their families. Many of the teachers continue to teach even though they have not been paid for two years. When they receive their salary they will be reimbursed for the back pay they have not received. This seems to have worked in the past and we (and they) hope it will hold true for the future as well. The school where our secondary students attend, College Dumas, is a private school run by a Catholic organization in Canada and plans to continue through July so our students will have a full school year. We are grateful for their continuing commitment to Haiti and Haiti's children. Our students in college continue to work hard and they continually send their thanks and gratitude.

As is the custom in our church, there are no news letters through the summer months. This year, that will be June, July and August. If there are events or articles of news or information that come up through the summer we send them out individually as they occur. In keeping with that policy we will be doing the same with the Haiti News as well. So we hope and pray you will have a good and safe and fun summer and will return with us in September renewed and refreshed and ready to send children to school, feed them and encourage and help them in any way we can. In the meantime we hope you will keep Haiti, Haiti's children and families, the restavec children of Haiti and the world and families of the Haiti Mission School in your thoughts and prayers

Thank you from our Boards (Haitian & US), students, families, facility and friends for your continuing encouragement, support and prayers for us and for our Haitian sisters and brothers. Blessings.

Caldwell Presbyterian Preschool is excited to the mission of the month. This year our total enrollment was 22 children and four part time staff. The preschool had over a dozen different field trips and family gatherings of our school community. We are growing and learning everyday. We have many new curriculum ideas to keep our school up to date and relevant. We would like to have an outside classroom ready for next year. We have already started by composting and planting a garden to be ready for fall. We have added a gate to the parking lot entrance and a mud kitchen.


